- 1. Only when **a** comes first.
- 2. In present active infinitives **a/**+ **ei^** contracts to **an** instead of **#n**.
- 3. This combination forms a diphthong only when the open vowel ( **a**, **e**, or **o**) comes first.
- 4. Only when **e** comes first.
- 5. In present active infinitives **o**/+ **ei^** contracts to **oun** instead of **oin**.

Note: The contracted **a** is always long.

This chart illustrates how Greek vowels contract, especially in contract verbs. Normally the vowel in the left column will occur first in a word and the vowel in the top row will be the first vowel of the suffix.

Example: uncontracted form - agapa + eij
vowel contraction - a + ei = #
contracted form - agap#j
